

# Vicar's Musings

I'm not sure that the Premier planned it this way (perhaps that was organised by someone with more divine credentials) but what a blessing it is on this Advent Sunday, the first Sunday of the new Christian year, that we are able to gather together in numbers approaching those we used to experience before the pandemic. Under the current density quotient rules (4m2 per person) St Peter's Church is able to accommodate up to 87 people in total, so long as everyone wears a mask and observes spatial distancing at all times of 1.5m (marriage partners and members of the same family are exempt from this rule of course). This limit of 87 people comprises of: 55 congregants in the Pews; 12 Clergy and Servers in the Sanctuary; a Choir of up to five people, in addition to our Musical Director and Organist, in the Gallery; 5 in the Handfield Chapel; and a further overflow of up to 6 people at the back of church with the 2 Sidespeople.

We will probably be unlikely to go over this limit of 87 people at most celebrations of the Mass, on a regular Sunday or Feast Day at least, but I would hate us to ever have to turn away congregant number 88, so for the time being we will keep the Book-a-pew system in place. To make things run more smoothly, however, and to assist our Parish Administrator, we will refine the system a little. There will now be three ways you can Book-a-pew:

- Through TryBooking (preferred). There will be a new link each week, which will be printed in the pew sheet, and also e-mailed to all parishioners in either the Monday or the Friday newsletters (if you don't receive these newsletters please let Kosta know in the Parish Office). The link for the 10.30am Mass this week, on Advent Sunday, 29th November is:

- By e-mail. If you are not comfortable with TryBooking, or have lost the link for the Mass you wish to attend, don't worry, you can still e-mail Kosta in the Parish Office (<a href="mailto:sphoffice@stpeters.org.au">sphoffice@stpeters.org.au</a>) and let him know the service that you would like to attend; he will add your name to the list.
- By phone. I am aware that there are some parishioners who do not have a computer, so please be assured that you can easily book a pew by phone still, by calling Kosta on (03) 9662 2391.

Over the lock-down our 10.30am Sunday Mass became a sort of amalgam of the former 8am, 9.30am and 11am Masses. For the time being, as we rebuild our Sunday congregation, we will keep with just the one Sunday Mass at 10.30am. For those who have children, please do join us at this 10.30am Mass, and we will provide children's

activities. In due course, however, as parishioners return to church, we will look at introducing at least one other Sunday service. One of the strictures here, however, is that State Government restrictions require at least one full hour between services, so that the church can be thoroughly cleaned. This means that our former pattern of Sunday worship (8am, 9.30am and 11am) will not be feasible until this restriction is eased.

For those who are unwell, or do not feel confident yet returning to face-to-face worship, we will keep live-streaming Sunday Mass on FaceBook and YouTube (for the links see <a href="https://www.stpeters.org.au">www.stpeters.org.au</a>).



# SUNDAY MASS READINGS

First Reading: Isaiah 63.16b-17; 64.1, 3-8

You, O Lord, are our father; "Our Redeemer from of old" is your name. Why, O Lord, do you make us stray from your ways and harden our heart, so that we do not fear you? Turn back for the sake of your servants, for the sake of the tribes that are your heritage. O that you would tear open the heavens and come down, so that the mountains would quake at your presence. When you did awesome deeds that we did not expect, you came down, the mountains quaked at your presence. From ages past no one has heard, no ear has perceived, no eye has seen any God besides you, who works for those who wait for him. You meet those who gladly do right, those who remember you in your ways. But you were angry, and we sinned; because you hid yourself we transgressed. We have all become like one who is unclean, and all our righteous deeds are like a filthy cloth. We all fade like a leaf, and our iniquities, like the wind, take us away. There is no one who calls on your name, or attempts to take hold of you; for you have hidden your face from us, and have delivered us into the hand of our iniquity. Yet, O Lord, you are our Father; we are the clay, and you are our potter; we are all the work of your hand.

### Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 1.3-9

My brothers and sisters: Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ. I give thanks to my God always for you because of the grace of God that has been given you in Christ Jesus, for in every way you have been enriched in him, in speech and knowledge of every kind - just as the testimony of Christ has been strengthened among you - so that you are not lacking in any spiritual gift as you wait for the revealing of our Lord Jesus Christ. He will also strengthen you to the end, so that you may be blameless on the day of our Lord Jesus Christ. God is faithful; by him you were called into fellowship with his Son, Jesus Christ our Lord.

### **Gospel:** Mark 13.31-37

Jesus said to his disciples: "Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will not pass away. But about that day or hour no one knows, neither the angels in heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father. Beware, keep alert; for you do not know when the time will come. It is like a man going on a journey, when he leaves home and puts his slaves in charge, each with a particular task, and commands the doorkeeper to be on the watch. Therefore, keep awake - in the evening, or at midnight, or at cockcrow, or at dawn, or else he may find you asleep when he comes suddenly. And what I say to you I say to all: Keep awake."

### PARISH SUPPORT FOR SAME-SEX BLESSINGS

At our parish AGM on Sunday, 22/11, the parish of St Peter's unanimously passed its response to the recent opinion of the Appellate Tribunal on the service of blessing for persons in civil marriages, as proposed by the Diocese of Wangaratta.


### ADVENT GROUP AT ST PETER'S

As we commence Advent, at the end of an extraordinary year in the collective liminal space of the global pandemic, Bishop Kate Prowd and Rev'd Dr Wendy Crouch will be reflecting with us on our journey through the 'betwixt and between' of liminal spaces with their gifts as well as challenges.



The backwards approach taken here allows the movement to be in the opposite direction, enabling us to get under the skin of a complex narrative.
