Vicar's Musings

Our Christmas-countdown is almost complete. Today we light the fourth and final Advent Candle and enjoy the children's excitement, as they get closer to lighting the Nativity Candle in the centre of our Advent Wreath.

On Thursday we commenced traditional another Christmascountdown: the praying of "O Antiphons". It is traditional from 17th to 23rd December, at the evening prayer of Vespers each day, to recite in turn seven special prayers, calling on the Messiah to come (in Latin: veni), addressing Christ by seven divine names found in the Old Testament: O Wisdom! (sapientia); O Lord! (adonai); O Root of Jesse! (radix); O Key of David! (clavis); O



Dayspring! (oriens); O King of Nations! (Rex gentium); O God-with-us! (Emmanuel).

The words of the Advent hymn "O come, O come, Emmanuel" that we will sing at today's Mass, are drawn from these ancient Christian prayers (NEH 11). You may like to take your liturgy sheet home, and make this hymn your prayer each night, as we approach Christmas Day.



Sunday Mass Readings

First Reading: 2 Samuel 7.1-5, 8b-12, 14a, 16

Now when David, the king, was settled in his house, and the Lord had given him rest from all his enemies around him, the king said to the prophet Nathan, "See now, I am living in a house of cedar, but the ark of God stays in a tent." Nathan said to the king, "Go, do all that you have in mind, for the Lord is with you." But that same night the word of the Lord came to Nathan: "Go and tell my servant David: Thus says the Lord: Are you the one to build me a house to live in? I took you from the pasture, from following the sheep to be prince over my people Israel: and I have been with you wherever you went, and have cut off all your enemies from before you; and I will make for you a great name, like the name of the great ones of the earth. And I will appoint a place for my people Israel and will plant them, so that they may live in their own place, and be disturbed no more; and evildoers shall afflict them no more, as formerly, from the time that I appointed judges over my people Israel; and I will give you rest from all your enemies. Moreover the Lord declares to you, David, that the Lord will make you a house. When your days are fulfilled and you lie down with your ancestors, I will raise up your offspring after you, who shall come forth from your body, and I will establish his kingdom. I will be a father to him, and he shall be a son to me. Your house and your kingdom shall be made sure forever before me; your throne, David, shall be established forever."

Second Reading: Romans 16.25-27

To God who is able to strengthen you according to my gospel and the proclamation of Jesus Christ, according to the revelation of the mystery that was kept secret for long ages but is now disclosed, and through the prophetic writings is made known to all the Gentiles, according to the command of the eternal God, to bring about the obedience of faith - to the only wise God, through Jesus Christ, to whom be the glory forever! Amen.

Gospel: Luke 1.26-38

In the sixth month the angel Gabriel was sent by God to a town in Galilee called Nazareth, to a virgin engaged to a man whose name was Joseph, of the house of David. The virgin's name was Mary. And the angel came to Mary and said, "Greetings, favoured one! The Lord is with you." But she was much perplexed by his words and pondered what sort of greeting this might be. The angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favour with God. And now, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you will name him Jesus. He will be great, and will be called the Son of the Most High, and the Lord God will give to him the throne of his ancestor David. He will reign over the house of Jacob forever, and of his kingdom there will be no end." Mary said to the angel, "How can this be, since I am a virgin?" The angel said to her, "The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you; therefore the child to be born will be holy; he will be called Son of God. And now, your relative Elizabeth in her old age has also conceived a son; and this is the sixth month for her who was said to be barren For nothing will be impossible with God." Then Mary said, "Here am I, the servant of the Lord; let it be with me according to your word." Then the angel departed from her.


THE DAILY OFFICE AT HOME


A novel which can make a perfect gift or enjoyable light reading over the Christmas season:
