

Gracious God, you chose the virgin Mary, by your grace, to be the mother of our Lord and Saviour: so fill us with your grace, that with her we may rejoice in your salvation, and in all things embrace your will; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. *Amen*.

Vicar's Musings

The root of the word Advent is the Latin verb *venire* "to come." Over these weeks, together as a Church, we await the blessed Incarnation, the coming of the Christ Child. Our children easily grasp this "waiting for Christmas." But Advent is a two-fold anticipation; we also look to the fulfillment of time, Christ's second coming in glory. The Advent Collect, from the *Book of Common Prayer*, tells so poetically of this dual expectancy:

Almighty God, give us grace that we may cast away the works of darkness, and put upon us the armour of light, now in the time of this mortal life, in which thy Son Jesus Christ came to visit us in great humility; that in the last day, when he shall come again in his glorious majesty to judge both the quick and the dead, we may rise to the life immortal, through him who liveth and reigneth with thee and the Holy Ghost, now and ever. Amen.

Another of the great Advent prayers of the Church, or rather a series of prayers, is the "O Antiphons". It is traditional from 17th to 23rd December, at the evening prayer of Vespers each day, to recite or chant in turn these seven prayers before or after a psalm or canticle. The coming Christ is addressed by seven divine titles from the Old Testament: O Wisdom! (sapientia); O Lord! (adonai); O Root of Jesse! (radix); O Key of David! (clavis); O Dayspring! (oriens); O King of Nations! (Rex gentium); O God-with-us! (Emmanuel).

This evening's antiphon evokes Christ the King, O Rex Gentium. The paradoxical reconciliation of supreme power and the most intimate human desire is only made possible in and through the cornerstone of Christ; the mysterious intersection of transcendence and imminence. And in this great mystery lies salvation for all. The unsurpassed ruler of all Nations is also the primal Creator, descending into the dirt and messiness of existence, and lovingly shaping the clay of creation. May this too be our prayer as night falls today ...

O Rex Gentium, et desideratus earum, lapisque angularis, qui facis utraque unum: veni, et salva hominem, quem de limo formasti.

O King of the nations, and their desire, the cornerstone making both one:
Come and save the human race, which you fashioned from clay.

BISHOP STEPHEN COTTRELL TO BE ARCHBISHOP OF YORK



Mass Readings

First Reading: Isaiah 7.10-14

The Lord spoke to Ahaz, "Ask a sign of the Lord your God; let it be deep as Sheol or high as heaven." But Ahaz said, "I will not ask, and I will not put the Lord to the test." Then Isaiah said: "Hear then, O house of David! Is it too little for you to weary mortals, that you weary my God also? Therefore the Lord himself will give you a sign. Look, the young woman is with child and shall bear a son, and shall name him Immanuel."


Second Reading: Romans 1.1-7

From Paul, a servant of Jesus Christ, called to be an apostle, set apart for the gospel of God, which God promised beforehand through his prophets in the holy scriptures: the gospel concerning his Son, who was descended from David according to the flesh and was declared to be Son of God with power according to the spirit of holiness by resurrection from the dead, Jesus Christ our Lord. Through Christ we have received grace and apostleship to bring about the obedience of faith among all the Gentiles for the sake of his name, including yourselves who are called to belong to Jesus Christ.

To all God's beloved in Rome, who are called to be saints: Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

Gospel Reading: Matthew 1.18-24

The birth of Jesus the Messiah took place in this way. When his mother Mary had been engaged to Joseph, but before they lived together, she was found to be with child from the Holy Spirit. Her husband Joseph, being a righteous man and unwilling to expose her to public disgrace, planned to dismiss her quietly. But just when he had resolved to do this, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, "Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary as your wife, for the child conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. She will bear a son, and you are to name him Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins." All this took place to fulfil what had been spoken by the Lord through the prophet: "Look, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and they shall name him Emmanuel," which means, "God is with us." When Joseph awoke from sleep, he did as the angel of the Lord commanded him; he took her as his wife.

BUSHFIRE APPEAL BUSHFIRE EMERGENCY APPEAL

The Anglican Relief & Development Fund Australia is appealing for prayer (most importantly!) and financial donations to help those in New South Wales and Queensland who have been affected by recent bushfires. In New South Wales, four people are reported to have died and 176 houses, 8 facilities and 314 outbuildings are confirmed lost. 
