
## Vicar's Musings

#### All Saints and All Souls

Today we celebrate the great Feast Day of All Saints, and tomorrow All Souls. This is the first weekend that we are permitted to celebrate the Mass in public again, although numbers are limited to 10 indoors and 20 outdoors. So, please do not turn up to church unannounced for the time being, as it would be terrible to have to turn anyone away. From next week, Sunday 8th November, we will be reinstituting our "book a pew" system (see below for details). Throughout the restrictions easing period (and no doubt beyond) we will continue to live-stream our services on FaceBook and YouTube, so if you can't attend in person do still join us for Mass online.

#### **Attending Mass in Person**

These are the guidelines for attending Mass in person, as outlined by our Archbishop in his newsletter to clergy this week: "Ten people may meet inside plus one cleric or ASLM for a service. The outdoors limit is raised to twenty people with one cleric or ASLM. For both indoors and outdoors, all the usual COVID-safe measures must be enforced, including: social distancing (4sqm, 1.5m apart), sanitiser, attendance records, contactless giving for offerings, no shared utensils or books, masks to be worn all the time (apart from the one person leading at the time), minimal singing, no mingling before or after the service, no overlap of people for other services, disinfectant cleaning of all high touch surfaces,



seats and toilets in between services. Apart from the one cleric or ASLM leading the service, any servers, musicians, assistant clergy etc., are to be counted in the maximum attendance limits. Only one service can be held at a time, indoors or outdoors."

How to "Book a Pew" for Sunday or Feast Day Mass

Until restrictions are significantly eased, there will be limited numbers allowed in church, so those who wish to attend Mass in person on Sundays or on special Feast Days must "Book a Pew" well in advance. It is a simple procedure, but you must plan ahead, or you may risk being turned away from church (which would be awful):

- Very important: you must "book a pew" at least 48 hours (2 days) in advance of any service you wish to attend

- Make sure to leave your name and phone number

- Indicate the date or dates of the services you would like to attend
- Please note: if the service is already fully booked, you will not be able to attend. We will contact you well in advance, however, if this is the case.

#### Regular Weekday Mass – Just Turn Up!

Weekday Mass congregations are usually well below the requisite ten, so please do feel free to just turn up. The Archbishop's guidelines (see above) apply to all public services. Here is a list of the weekday Masses at St Peter's:

#### SUMMARY OF PARISH COUNCIL MEETING

The main agenda item at this week's Parish Council meeting was the 2021-23 Mission Action Plan, which will be presented to the Annual Meeting. In addition. Fr Hugh gave a brief report, which is summarised below.

Worship & Devotions: Wednesday 28 October saw the end of 111 days of closure for public worship; for new COVIDSafe guidelines see parish website. The Rev'd Christine Angus, based in Ballarat, will join the St Peter's clergy quarterly. Livestreaming to continue as face-to-face Mass returns.

**Annual Meeting:** By Zoom this year. E-mail/Postal voting ahead of the meeting. Main agenda item: Mission Action Plan presentation.

**Parish Staff:** Successful renewal of RMIT contract for 2 more years. Interview for Youth Minister position next week.

**Pastoral Care:** Telephone Tree – going well. Face-to-face (e.g. home communion) now possible again, within guidelines.

**Christian Education:** Children's Church – on-line. Confirmation preparation – on-line. EFM – equipment to be purchased enabling combined face-to-face & on-line. Two Advent courses this year: Lectio Divina (Roland Ashby, Fr Greg & Fr Hugh); Poetry of Christina Rosetti (Carol O'Connor).

**Social Enterprise:** Fundraising for Meals Program. Meals Program part-time staff appointments – Durga Prasad Kantharaj; Marie Jean-Francois. Student café & clothing exchange launched in October. New website: <a href="www.heavenatthehill.org">www.heavenatthehill.org</a>

**Foundation:** Christmas Appeal - gift packs for homeless and international students. Parish Hall Development – Foundation is keen to commence fundraising in 2021.



## Sunday Mass Readings

First Reading: Revelation 7.2-4, 9-14

I, John, saw an angel ascending from the rising of the sun, having the seal of the living God, and he called with a loud voice to the four angels who had been given power to damage earth and sea, saying, "Do not damage the earth or the sea or the trees, until we have marked the servants of our God with a seal on their foreheads." And I heard the number of those who were sealed, one hundred forty-four thousand, sealed out of every tribe of the people of Israel. After this I looked, and there was a great multitude that no one could count, from every nation, from all tribes and peoples and languages, standing before the throne and before the Lamb, robed in white, with palm branches in their hands. They cried out in a loud voice, "Salvation belongs to our God who is seated on the throne, and to the Lamb!" And all the angels stood around the throne, around the elders and the four living creatures; they fell on their faces before the throne and worshipped God, singing, "Amen! Then one of the elders addressed me, "Who are these, robed in white, and where have they come from?" I said to him, "Sir, you are the one that knows." #### **GREAT NEWS!**


