Vicar's Musings

There is a lot happening at St Peter's at the moment. My Musings this week are again an update on some current parish issues, by way of transparency and clear communication.

Update on our Roof Works

The replacement of the Apex section of the Church roof is well underway. This past week there was a huge "downpour" of 170 years of dust, not to mention some rain to boot! We covered the carpet and furniture as best we could, and made sure that the organ was protected also, but there was still a huge clean-up afterwards. My thanks to our Acting-Sacristan, Eugene Chin, and a small team of volunteers who worked tirelessly over the week to get things ready for Sunday. Work on southern face of the Apex roof is now nearing completion, and in 10 days work will start on the northern face; so more dust is on its way! Thank you for your patience during the works.

Grand Opening of the Corner Plaza

Although the Corner Plaza has now been open for a few weeks, there are a some final jobs that are holding up the completion of the project: cleaning and restoration of the Wayside Cross, manufacture and installation of a security gate near the Maynard Kitchen, and completion of the roof-works. As June is fast approaching, we are not confident that the project will be fully finished in time for our Patronal Festival. In addition, neither the Archbishop nor the Governor General are available on that day. So, the current proposal is that we reschedule the Grand Opening for Sunday 10th November, after a 10am Parish High Mass. This date has a number of advantages: we can be confident that all the works will be complete; the weather is likely to be warmer; we have another opportunity to invite key dignitaries; and of course, the eve of Remembrance Day is a very fitting time for the re-dedication of our Wayside Cross.

Parish Support Team Process

Last month the Parish Council unanimously voted in support of Bp Genieve's "Support Teams" process, which is now underway. There are copies of the flier outlining this Diocesan process at the back of church and on the Welcome Table in the hall on Sundays. The Bishop's delegates, directing the process are: the Rev'd Wendy Wade, and Mr Alan Grant. Over the past 10 days Wendy and Alan have met with the Vicar, and with the Wardens, and next week they will be meeting with the other members of Parish Council. Other meetings beyond these will be arranged in due course. MYSTICS ANONYMOUS - CONTEMPLATIVE PRAYER GROUP


The "Mystics Anonymous" contemplative prayer group has recommenced, and all are welcome to attend each Wednesday at 2:30pm in the Vicarage. We are currently undertaking a 5 week introduction to St Ignatius of Loyola's "First Spiritual Exercises". Each week is a self-standing meditation, so do feel free to join us at any stage.

Mass Readings

First Reading: Acts 13.14, 43-52

Paul and Barnabas went on from Perga and came to Antioch in Pisidia. On the sabbath day they went into the synagogue and sat down. When the meeting of the synagogue broke up, many Jews and devout converts to Judaism followed Paul and Barnabas, who spoke to them and urged them to continue in the grace of God. The next sabbath almost the whole city gathered to hear the word of the Lord. But when the Jewish officials saw the crowds, they were filled with jealousy; and blaspheming, they contradicted what was spoken by Paul. Then both Paul and Barnabas spoke out boldly, saying, "It was necessary that the word of God should be spoken first to you. Since you reject it and judge yourselves to be unworthy of eternal life, we are now turning to the Gentiles. For so the Lord has commanded us, saying, I have set you to be a light for the Gentiles, so that you may bring salvation to the ends of the earth." When the Gentiles heard this, they were glad and praised the word of the Lord; and as many as had been destined for eternal life became believers. Thus the word of the Lord spread throughout the region. But the officials incited the devout women of high standing and the leading men of the city, and stirred up persecution against Paul and Barnabas, and drove them out of their region. So they shook the dust off their feet in protest against them, and went to Iconium. And the disciples were filled with joy and with the Holy Spirit.

Second Reading : Revelation 7.9, 14b-17

After this I, John, looked, and there was a great multitude that no one could count, from every nation, from all tribes and peoples and languages, standing before the throne and before the Lamb, robed in white, with palm branches in their hands. And one of the elders then said to me, "These are they who have come out of the great ordeal; they have washed their robes and made them white in the blood of the Lamb. For this reason they are before the throne of God, and worship him day and night within his temple, and the one who is seated on the throne will shelter them. They will hunger no more, and thirst no more; the sun will not strike them, nor any scorching heat; for the Lamb at the centre of the throne will be their shepherd, and he will guide them to springs of the water of life, and God will wipe away every tear from their eyes."

Gospel : John 10.27-30



Next week St Peter's Bookroom will attend for two days the Jumbunna Clergy Conference at the Foothills Conference Centre, Mooroolbark.


