
WELCOME TO ST PETER'S


Please read carefully and observe all the requisite COVID-Safe guidelines below:

- If you are feeling unwell, especially with COVID-19-type symptoms, you must not be at church; please go home now and get tested.
- Masks are not mandatory, but you are encouraged to wear them if you can't socially distance or when you sing.
- The 2m² density quotient at St Peter's allows for up to 110 people in the pews, and a total congregation (including choir, servers, children's church, overflow etc) of up to 174 people.
- 2m² spatial distancing essentially means keeping an elbow's distance from others at all times (other than partners and immediate family members).
- We provide sanitiser for your hands at the entrance to church.
- Holy Communion is in one kind only, with no common cup.
- You are advised not to shake hands, hug, or kiss others beyond your partner or immediate family.
- All service booklets are single use only, so please take yours home.

When you arrive at church you must "sign in" using the new State Government approved QR Code system at the door. If you have any difficulties, the sidesperson will assist you.

Please note: we have a busy programme of worship, social service and hall bookings at St Peter's Eastern Hill, seven days a week, but the church and hall are cleaned and sanitised daily, under WorkSafe pandemic guidelines, so you can be assured of the cleanliness of our buildings and furnishings.

Weekly Musings

A common theme in today's readings is God's love.

You might say that's a theme in all scripture, but there's something specific about how love is discussed in today's readings that sets them apart from the focuses of Lent: the authority of Jesus' teaching and what authentic discipleship looks like, from the triumphal bodily resurrection of Christ in our Easter readings, to the commandment that Jesus' disciples love one another, as he himself prepares to ascend to the Father.

Another striking theme from today's reading is what God's love looks like--yes it is impartial, includes outsiders and has been made known to the world to bring joy. But it is also firmly grounded in the workings of the Trinity.

God the Father shows his love, not only in creation, but through the Incarnation, or the sending of his Son into the world. Through the Incarnation we are given a chance to understand love itself, and by that means the nature of God.

God the Son is the sacrifice that is offered and received. Because the Father loves him, he loves his followers. He then commands his followers to love one another until he comes again.

And in the first reading from Acts, God the Holy Spirit shows God's love because it visits those who are outsiders and leads them to baptism, through which means they are initiated into Christian life and the Body of Christ.


God's love: impartial, inclusive and joyful has been revealed to us through the mysterious workings of the Trinity. We stand assured of His love for us--and seek to love one another with a sincere heart--as we await his coming again in glory.

Sunday Mass Readings

First Reading: Acts 10.25-26, 34-35, 44-48

On Peter's arrival at Caesarea, Cornelius, a centurion of the Roman cohort, met him, and falling at his feet, worshiped him. But Peter made him get up, saying, "Stand up; I am only a mortal." Then Peter began to speak to those assembled in the house of Cornelius, "I truly understand that God shows no partiality, but in every nation anyone who fears him and does what is right is acceptable to him. While Peter was still speaking, the Holy Spirit fell upon all who heard the word. The circumcised believers who had come with Peter were astounded that the gift of the Holy Spirit had been poured out even on the Gentiles, for they heard them speaking in tongues and extolling God. Then Peter said, "Can anyone withhold the water for baptizing these people who have received the Holy Spirit just as we have?" So he ordered them to be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ. Then they invited him to stay for several days.

Psalm: 98.1, 2-3ab, 3cd-4



O sing to the Lord a new song, for he has done marvelous things.

His right hand and his holy arm have brought him victory.

The Lord has made known his victory; he has revealed his vindication in the sight of the nations. He has remembered his steadfast love and faithfulness to the house of Israel.

All the ends of the earth have seen the victory of our God.

Second Reading: 1 John 4.7-10

Beloved, let us love one another, because love is from God; everyone who loves is born of God and knows God. Whoever does not love does not know God, for God is love. God's love was revealed among us in this way: God sent his only Son into the world so that we might live through him. In this is love, not that we loved God but that he loved us and sent his Son to be the atoning sacrifice for our sins.

Gospel: John 15.9-17

Jesus said to his disciples: "As the Father has loved me, so I have loved you; abide in my love. If you keep my commandments, you will abide in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and abide in his love. I have said these things to you so that my joy may be in you, and that your joy may be complete. This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you. No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends. You are my friends if you do what I command you. I do not call you servants any longer, because the servant does not know what the master is doing; but I have called you friends, because I have made known to you everything that I have heard from my Father. You did not choose me but I chose you. And I appointed you to go and bear fruit, fruit that will last, so that the Father will give you whatever you ask him in my name. I am giving you these commands so that you may love one another."

NEW CHECK-IN QR SYSTEM FOR THE PARISH - "GUEST TRACK"

In line with the Victorian State Government's new regulations, implemented last Friday, St Peter's is required to adopt a new QR Code system: "GuestTrack." Unfortunately "Try Booking" does not connect with the Service Victoria app. and is therefore no longer compliant. So, there is now no need to book-a-pew ahead of time when you come to St Peter's. Just come to church and sign-in at the door. If you have a smart phone, once you have registered, this will be very quick for you each Sunday. For those who don't have a smart phone, or Internet access, the sidespeople at Mass can sign in for you on the parish phone, or take your details as before. Please be patient, and kind towards our sidespeople, as we get this new system up and running. Thank you.


