

Vicar's Musings

This week there was a special meeting of the Parish Council ahead of today's Statutory Meetings. As is my usual practice after Parish Council, the Musings this week are a summary of some of the main points from the meeting, for the purposes of communication with the parish.

Farewell to Adam Blackmore and David Morrell

There was a deep sense of sadness on Parish Council that Adam Blackmore has resigned as Sacristan, and that he and David are moving to Ballarat. Adam was first appointed Sacristan in 1999, served for many years as Vestry Secretary, as well as on the Servers' Guild, and David has been a very active and valued volunteer at St Peter's for more than eight years. Every member of PC expressed their thanks to "the boys" for their deep commitment to the parish, and we wish them well as they move to Ballarat. Last Sunday there was an informal farewell and a gift given to Adam and David, and we are hoping there will be a more formal occasion in due course for the wider parish to express our sincere thanks.

Usage of Keble House

Due to mistakes made by our land agents, who manage the Keble House flats, we have been forced to renew the upstairs tenancy at 471 Albert Street, rather than repurpose the usage, as was originally proposed by the Wardens. From April, Klingner Scholar, Brenda Williams, will be renting the 471 Albert Street downstairs flat and contributing significantly to the pastoral care program of the parish.

Conflict Resolution Process

Bishop Genieve has given some helpful pointers as to how we might move forward as a parish. The Council resolved to invite our bishop to the next PC meeting, to explore the Diocesan "Parish Support Teams" conflict resolution process and how this might work in the parish.

Corner Plaza Completion, Wayside Cross, and Church Roof

The Corner Plaza works are nearing completion. There has been a slight delay due primarily to the security gate manufacturer failing to deliver on time. Once the hoardings come down the Wayside Cross will then be cleaned and restored. Then in April work will commence on the final section of the church roof, for which we received a generous grant many months ago, but have been waiting until the Corner Plaza is finished. A grand opening is planned for St Peter's Day this year.

Songs of Praise at St Peter's - Saturday the 19th October 2019, 2.30pm

PC approved an exciting new St Peter's Catholic Evangelism initiative. "Songs of Praise" will be a joint fund-raising event organised by the St Peter's Choir and Australian Anglican Church Calendars. There will be an entry fee of \$30 for which each person receives a copy of the 2020 AACC calendar, a feast of singing well-known hymns, and afternoon tea. 

Mass Readings

First Reading: Genesis 15.5-12, 17-18

The Lord brought Abram outside and said, "Look toward heaven and count the stars, if you are able to count them." Then the Lord said to him, "So shall your descendants be." And Abram believed the Lord; and the Lord reckoned it to him as righteousness. Then the Lord said to Abram, "I am the Lord who brought you from Ur of the Chaldeans, to give you this land to possess." But Abram said, "O Lord God, how am I to know that I shall possess it?" The Lord said to him, "Bring me a heifer three years old, a female goat three years old, a ram three years old, a turtledove, and a young pigeon." Abram brought the Lord all these and cut them in two, laying each half over against the other; but he did not cut the birds in two. And when birds of prey came down on the carcasses, Abram drove them away. As the sun was going down, a deep sleep fell upon Abram, and a deep and terrifying darkness descended upon him. When the sun had gone down and it was dark, a smoking fire pot and a flaming torch passed between these pieces. On that day the Lord made a covenant with Abram, saying, "To your descendants I give this land, from the river of Egypt to the great river, the river Euphrates."

Second Reading: Philippians 3.17 - 4.1

Brothers and sisters, join in imitating me, and observe those who live according to the example you have in us. For many live as enemies of the cross of Christ; I have often told you of them, and now I tell you even with tears. Their end is destruction; their god is the belly; and their glory is in their shame; their minds are set on earthly things. But our citizenship is in heaven, and it is from there that we are expecting a Saviour, the Lord Jesus Christ. He will transform the body of our humiliation that it may be conformed to the body of his glory, by the power that also enables him to make all things subject to himself. Therefore, my brothers and sisters, whom I love and long for, my joy and crown, stand firm, my beloved, in the Lord in this way.

Gospel: Luke 9.28b-36

Jesus took with him Peter and John and James, and went up on the mountain to pray. And while he was praying, the appearance of his face changed, and his clothes became dazzling white. Suddenly they saw two men, Moses and Elijah, talking to Jesus. They appeared in glory and were speaking of his departure, which he was about to accomplish at Jerusalem. Now Peter and his companions were weighed down with sleep; but since they had stayed awake, they saw his glory and the two men who stood with him. Just as Moses and Elijah were leaving Jesus, Peter said to him, "Master, it is good for us to be here; let us make three tents, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah." Peter did not know what he was saying. While Peter was saying this, a cloud came and overshadowed them; and they were terrified as they entered the cloud. Then from the cloud came a voice that said, "This is my Son, my Chosen; listen to him!" When the voice had spoken, Jesus was found alone. And the disciples kept silent and in those days told no one any of the things they had seen.










An exhibition of paintings on Dante La Vita Nuova

The images in La Vita Nuova are meditation pieces. The work consists of a number of small paintings inscribed with Dante's text.

The figure is in a state of meditation, or preparation: the viewer is invited to approach this meditating figure in various circumstances recalled by the script. These words evoke transitoriness, fragility, the impermanence of human life: mortality.

The story is also a reflection on the idea of undying love.

La Vita Nuova was first exhibited at St Francis' Pastoral Centre: St Francis' Church, Lonsdale Street in 2001. It is dedicated to the memory of Rachel Barber, who departed this life in 1999 at the age of fifteen.

PROFESSIONAL STANDARDS SEMINAR AT ST PETER'S

TUESDAY 30TH APRIL AT 10AM - 3PM IN THE PARISH HALL

It is a requirement of Archbishop in Council that all the following members of St Peter's Eastern Hill attend at least one Professional Standards Seminar in 2019: Clergy, Parish Lay Staff, Churchwardens, Parish Council members, Lay Ministers, and key parish volunteers (e.g servers, children's ministry etc). Please note that these training seminars are different from the OH&S sessions that were run in 2015. The Professional Standards seminars have been updated from the previous training that most Clergy have attended. Professional Standards Seminars should be completed every 3 years and anyone who has not attended a seminar since 2014 should attend one in 2019.

To assist St Peter's staff and volunteers in fulfilling this Diocesan requirement, we are hosting our own Professional Standards Seminar, facilitated by Ms Angela Cannon, at St Peter's Eastern Hill on Tuesday 30th April between 10am and 3pm in the Parish Hall. Tea and Coffee will be provided. Delegates will be required to sign the attendance sheet at the conclusion of the seminar to allow for entry into the Diocesan and Parish databases.

We are aware that this time may not suit everyone. If you are unable to attend this seminar, you will need to attend one of the other 2019 Diocesan Seminars. A list of these can be found at https://bit.ly/2WUY6Ua

Please note: If you have attended a Professional Standards Act seminar in the past three years you do not need to attend this seminar again. If you have not attended any – you are required to do so if you are in a ministry or key volunteer role.

Zambia: ST JOHN'S ANGLICAN SEMINARY

ABM has supported St John's Seminary for almost a decade now. It is the national seminary of the Anglican Church in Zambia, training ordinands and clergy from all five Anglican dioceses across Zambia. The training prepares them to minister in fast-growing urban and rural congregations of the Church. The seminary, which receives a small monthly grant from the National Church, does not charge tuition fees, in order to enable students from poor dioceses to attend. However, this operating grant is not enough to cover the seminary's expenses. It is dependent on donor aid for staff salary support, maintenance, its internet facility, and books for both the library and students' use after the training.

Australia: THE ABORIGINAL AND TORRES STRAIT ISLANDER MISSION FUND

With guidance from the National Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Anglican Council (NATSIAC), ABM makes small grants available to projects which express the marks of mission and benefit Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people.

Last year, grants from the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Mission Fund were used to strengthen youth ministry in Cape York, establish a new Aboriginal church, support young expectant mothers, and host a reconciliation art exhibition.


