
Vicar's Musings

Today we celebrate Laetare Sunday, the fourth Sunday in Lent. The name comes from the Latin *laetare*, the singular imperative of *laetari* "to rejoice", from the introit to the Latin Mass: *Lætare Jerusalem: et conventum facite omnes qui diligitis eam* "Rejoice, O Jerusalem: and come together all you that love her." Also known as Mothering Sunday or Refreshment Sunday, today is a day of relaxation from the rigours of the Lenten fast; a day of hope; a Paschal foretaste, 21 days ahead of our Easter celebrations. The Rose-coloured vestments, and the Simnel Cakes that we share today (thanks to the bakers!) are reminders of the rich liturgical traditions we inherit, and the profound theological truths on which they are built.

It is particularly fitting this week that the landscapers have returned the Corner Plaza site to the church, and taken down the blue fences that were first put up in August last year. All of us who have worked so hard towards this day are indeed most joyful and thankful: Warden and Project Manager, Nick Lambard-Scott; Foundation Chair, John Taaff; Fundraising Committee Chair, Krystyna Campbell-Pretty; Social Enterprise Committee Secretary, Bill Mole; and everyone who has supported the Project over the past four years on various committees and through your kind donations and prayers. *Deo gratias!*


As soon as the fences came down, the general public began enjoying the Corner Plaza space. "This is lovely; thank you!" one passer by said to me, as I was sitting on the new bench, enjoying the sun and waiting for a meeting with the Architect. There will be a grand opening around St Peter's Day, after the last bits and pieces are finished: a security gate, cleaning of the Wayside Cross, and some long-overdue work on the church roof. And in the meantime, on Palm Sunday, when we traditionally gather at the Wayside Cross, there will be a blessing of the Corner Plaza and the newly restored Memorial Garden.


After Easter the Social Enterprise Coffee Caravan will start trading on the Corner Plaza five days a week, providing volunteer opportunities and employment pathways for those experiencing homlessness. The SE Management Committee – myself (Acting-Chair), Bill Mole (Company Secretary), Barbara Tane (Treasurer), Max Skurrie and Alex Gamser – are working hard towards this goal, alongside the volunteer Operational Manager Ree Boddé: to fit out the coffee caravan with a coffee machine and other equipment, set up EFTPOS, register the business name "Heaven at The Hill", complete GST registration, finalise insurance, secure Melbourne City compliance, employ a Head Barista etc.



Mass Readings

First Reading: Joshua 5.9a, 10-12

After the Israelites had crossed over the Jordan river, and entered the promised land, the Lord said to Joshua, "Today I have rolled away from you the disgrace of Egypt." While the Israelites were camped in Gilgal they kept the Passover in the evening on the fourteenth day of the month in the plains of Jericho. On the day after the Passover, on that very day, they ate the produce of the land, unleavened cakes and parched grain. The manna ceased on the day they ate the produce of the land, and the Israelites no longer had manna; they ate the crops of the land of Canaan that year.

Psalm: 34.1-2, 3-4, 5-6



I will bless the Lord at all times;
his praise continually shall be in my mouth.
My soul makes its boast in the Lord;
let the humble hear and be glad. R.
O magnify the Lord with me,
and let us exalt his name together.
I sought the Lord, and he answered me,

Second Reading : 2 Corinthians 5.17-21

If anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation: everything old has passed away; see, everything has become new! All this is from God, who reconciled us to himself through Christ, and has given us the ministry of reconciliation; that is, in Christ, God was reconciling the world to himself, not counting their trespasses against them, and entrusting the message of reconciliation to us. So we are ambassadors for Christ, since God is making his appeal through us; we entreat you on behalf of Christ, be reconciled to God. For our sake God made Christ to be sin who knew no sin, so that in Christ we might become the righteousness of God.

Gospel: Luke 15.1-3, 11-32

All the tax collectors and sinners were coming near to listen to Jesus. And the Pharisees and the scribes were grumbling and saying, "This fellow welcomes sinners and eats with them." So he told them a parable: "There was a man who had two sons. The younger of them said to his father, 'Father, give me the share of the property that will belong to me.' So the father divided his property between them. A few days later the younger son gathered all he had and travelled to a distant country, and there he squandered his property in dissolute living. When he had spent everything, a severe famine took place throughout that country, and he began to be in need. So he went and hired himself out to one of the citizens of that country, who sent him to his fields to feed the pigs. The young man would gladly have filled himself with the pods that the pigs were eating; and no one gave him anything. "But when he came to himself he said, 'How many of my father's hired hands have bread enough and to spare, but here I am dying of hunger! I will get up and go to my father, and I will say to him, "Father, I have sinned against heaven and before you; I am no longer worthy to be called your son; treat me like one of your hired hands. So he set off and went to his father. But while he was still far off, his father saw him and was filled with compassion; he ran and put his arms around him and kissed him. Then the son said to him, 'Father, I have sinned against heaven and before you; I am no longer worthy to be called your son.' But the father said to his slaves, 'Quickly, bring out a robe—the best one—and put it on him; put a ring on his finger and sandals on his feet. And get the fatted calf and kill it, and let us eat and celebrate; for this son of mine was dead and is alive again; he was lost and is found!' And they began to celebrate. Now his elder son was in the field; and when he came and approached the house, he heard music and dancing. He called one of the slaves and asked what was going on. The slave replied, 'Your brother has come, and your father has killed the fatted calf, because he has got him back safe and sound.' Then the elder son became angry and refused to go in. His father came out and began to plead with him. But he answered his father, 'Listen! For all these years I have been working like a slave for you, and I have never disobeyed your command; yet you have never given me even a young goat so that I might celebrate with my friends. But when this son of yours came back, who has devoured your property with prostitutes, you killed the fatted calf for him!' Then the father said to him, 'Son, you are always with me, and all that is mine is yours. But we had to celebrate and rejoice, because this brother of yours was dead and has come to life; he was lost and has been found."


Easter cards are now available. And, a beautiful new range of Art Cards with whimsical and thoughtful sayings have come in this week.
