

Pantry Foods for food parcels for those sleeping rough (ring pull tins): ■ Small tins of fish/meat (tuna, sardines, chicken, spam etc) ■ Small serves fruit ■ Muesli bars ■ Single serve meals ■ Rice & pasta Biscuits & snack food. Breakfast Foods: Cereal – Cornflakes, Rice Bubbles, Weetbix etc ■ Spreads – Vegemite, honey, Peanut Butter, Strawberry Jam, Apricot Jam, Marmalade ■ Tea Bags ■ Coffee ■ Milo ■ Large tins of Baked Beans or Spaghetti ■ Large tins of fruit. Regular Food Parcels ■ Rice or Pasta ■ Tinned Vegetables ■ Baked Beans or Spaghetti ■ Tinned Soups ■ Pasta meals ■ Two minute noodles ■ Muesli bars ■ Biscuits – sweet or savoury ■ Tinned meat or fish ■ Pasta Sauce

Mass Readings

First Reading: Zechariah 12.10-11

The Lord says this: "I will pour out a spirit of compassion and supplication on the house of David and the inhabitants of Jerusalem, so that, when they look on the one whom they have pierced, they shall mourn for him, as one mourns for an only child, and weep bitterly over him, as one weeps over a firstborn. On that day the mourning in Jerusalem will be as great as the mourning for Hadad-rimmon in the plain of Megiddo."

Psalm: 63.1, 2-3, 4-5, 7-8



O God, you are my God, I seek you, my soul thirsts for you; my flesh faints for you, as in a dry and weary land where there is no water. R. So I have looked upon you in the sanctuary, beholding your power and glory. Because your steadfast love is better than life, my lips will praise you. So I will bless you as long as I live; I will lift up my hands and call on your name. My soul is satisfied as with a rich feast, and my mouth praises you with joyful lips. R. Second Reading : Galatians 3.26-29

My brothers and sisters, in Christ Jesus you are all children of God through faith. As many of you as were baptized into Christ have clothed yourselves with Christ. There is no longer Jew or Greek, there is no longer slave or free, there is no longer male and female; for all of you are one in Christ Jesus. And if you belong to Christ, then you are Abraham's offspring, heirs according to the promise.

Gospel: Luke 9.18-24

One day when Jesus was praying alone, with only the disciples near him, he asked them, "Who do the crowds say that I am?" They answered, "John the Baptist; but others, Elijah; and still others, that one of the ancient prophets has arisen." Jesus said to them, "But who do you say that I am?" Peter answered, "The Messiah of God." Jesus sternly ordered and commanded the disciples not to tell anyone, saying, "The Son of Man must undergo great suffering, and be rejected by the elders, chief priests, and scribes, and be killed, and on the third day be raised." Then Jesus said to them all, "If any want to become my followers, let them deny themselves and take up their cross daily and follow me. For those who want to save their life will lose it, and those who lose their life for my sake will save it."

COFFEE CARAVAN SOCIAL ENTERPRISE UPDATE & TASTING


The St Peter's Social Enterprise Management Committee is working hard towards the imminent launch of the Coffee Caravan. We now have an electric jockey wheel to move the caravan out onto the street frontage each day. This past week Genovese Coffee agreed to provide our coffee, umbrellas, and professional advice ahead of the launch. The Melbourne City Council compliance process is well underway, and will be complete in the next few weeks, enabling us to serve coffee and food to passers-by Monday to Friday each week.

St Peter's parishioners are warmly invited to a pre-launch tasting on Wednesday 26th June, from 10:00am to 2:00pm, and also at our Patronal Festival next Sunday 30th June after High Mass. The coffee will be free and your feedback and encouragement will be much appreciated. For these tastings the Coffee Caravan will be situated in the Parish Hall courtyard.

PARISH SUPPORT TEAM PROCESS UPDATE

Last month the Parish Council unanimously voted in support of Bp Genieve's recommended 'Support Teams Process for Parishes Experiencing Conflict'. The role of this team is to assist and support the leadership of the parish to deal well with conflict and to discern how to move forward constructively. While the team needs to understand the background, they do not take sides in a disagreement, make any decisions for the parish or arbitrate on a dispute. A flyer outlining more detail on this Diocesan process and role is available at the back of Church, and on Sundays at the Welcome Table in the Parish Hall. The Bishop's delegates supporting the process are: the Rev'd Wendy Wade and Dr Alan Grant. Over the past 4 weeks Wendy and Alan have held initial meetings with the Vicar, Wardens, Parish Council and some staff members. The Rev'd Mark McDonald has now been appointed to strengthen the team and enable work to continue during Alan's planned absence for the next month or so. Follow up meetings will be arranged with the parish leadership and the support team is also considering the timing of additional meetings with small groups of interested parishioners over the next several weeks. 

NOW IN PAPERBACK!

Phoebe: A Story by Paula Gooder

Sometime around 56 AD, the apostle Paul wrote to the church in Rome. His letter was arguably his theological masterpiece, and has continued to shape Christian faith ever since. He entrusted this letter to Phoebe, the deacon of the church at Cenchreae; in writing to the church that almost surely met in her home, Paul refers to her both as a deacon and as a helper or patron of many. But who was this remarkable woman?

In this, her first work of fiction, Biblical scholar and popular author and speaker Paula Gooder tells Phoebe's story – who she was, the life she lived and her first-century faith – and in doing so opens up Paul's theology, giving a



sense of the cultural and historical pressures that shaped Paul's thinking, and the faith of the early church.
