

Vicar's Musings

A number of key parish projects took significant steps forward this week. The Social Enterprise Coffee Caravan had its first street-corner trial on Friday. Five-day trading will commence in the first week of September, run by volunteers Rhys and Lee. The Parish Support Team congregational meetings have now been scheduled (see details below) and the Pastoral Care Review, called for by the Parish Statutory Meeting, is also underway. The Review of staff responsibilities and workload is still in the planning phase, and details will be announced soon. Our aim is to complete both Reviews in time for the Annual Meeting of the Parish in November.



PARISH SUPPORT TEAM PROCESS UPDATE

Over recent weeks, the Parish Support Team has met with the Wardens, Parish Council and some Staff to discuss concerns and conflicts which have arisen at St Peters over recent months. A number of other parishioners have requested meetings with the team. These meetings will be held with small groups of parishioners. The purpose is to provide an update on the process so far, and to explore other ideas for St Peter's moving forward constructively. The scheduled meeting times are:

- Sunday 28th July, 1:00-2:30pm after High Mass, in the Hughes Room.
- Thursday 1st August, 6:00-7:30pm, in the Handfield Chapel.
- Saturday 3rd August, 10:00-11:30am, in the Hughes Room.
- Sunday 4th August, 11:00am-12:30pm, after Family Mass in the Hughes Room.

The team envisages a minimum of 8 and maximum of 12 people at each meeting. Parishioners may not attend more than one meeting. As far as possible, priority will be given to those parishioners who have previously requested a meeting with the team. If the minimum numbers cannot be achieved at a particular time, parishioners may be requested to attend one of the other scheduled meetings, as numbers are important to the success of the process. PASTORAL CARE REVIEW

Background

The Pastoral care review is one of two reviews recommended by the Statutory Parish Meeting earlier this year. The Parish Council appointed a committee to steer the process, chaired by Dr Stephen Duckett.

Reviewer

Shirley Nash is a Clinical Pastoral Education (CPE) Supervisor, and has been a Pastoral Care practitioner for 18 years. Prior to that, her background was in Education and H.R. Shirley is a lifelong Anglican with experience on Parish Councils, Mission Planning, and as a Warden. Shirley is looking forward to conversations with parishioners about the future of Pastoral Care in the parish.

Terms of reference

- To review the pastoral care needs of the parish and people who use the site.
- To identify the best strategy to ensure that pastoral care needs are met, using both stipended staff and volunteers.
- To identify appropriate training needs for volunteers.
- To propose a process for on-going evaluation of the effectiveness of the Parish's pastoral care program.

Proposed approach

- One-on-one interviews with key staff and volunteers.
- Group meetings with: Review Committee; Parish Council; Pastoral Care Team.
- Sunday forums after Mass.
- Receiving written submissions (particularly from those not able to attend the scheduled meetings).
- Writing a Report for the Review Committee, which will in due course be shared with first Parish Council, and then the Annual Meeting of the Parish in November.

ORDINATION TO THE PRIESTHOOD - REV'D CHRISTINE ANGUS



Mass Readings

First Reading: Genesis 18.1-10a

The Lord appeared to Abraham by the oaks of Mamre, as Abraham sat at the entrance of his tent in the heat of the day. Abraham looked up and saw three men standing near him. When he saw them, he ran from the tent entrance to meet them, and bowed down to the ground. He said, "My lord, if I find favour with you, do not pass by your servant. Let a little water be brought, and wash your feet, and rest yourselves under the tree. Let me bring a little bread, that you may refresh yourselves, and after that you may pass on— since you have come to your servant." So they said, "Do as you have said." And Abraham hastened into the tent to Sarah, and said, "Make ready quickly three measures of choice flour, knead it, and make cakes." Abraham ran to the herd, and took a calf, tender and good, and gave it to the servant, who hastened to prepare it. Then he took curds and milk and the calf that he had prepared, and set it before them; and he stood by them under the tree while they ate. They said to Abraham, "Where is your wife Sarah?" And he said, "There, in the tent." Then one said, "I will surely return to you in due season, and your wife Sarah shall have a son."


O Lord, who may dwell on your holy hill?

She had a sister named Mary, who sat at the Lord's feet and listened to what he was saying. 
