# FR PHILIP'S MUSINGS

We are at the beginning of a New Year and, perhaps we have some time to prepare for the year ahead. Over the summer I have been reading the most recent edition of a standard text on pastoral care by American author Howard Clinebell. He introduces his 470 page tome with two parables. In the first Clinebell borrows Theodore Wendel's story of a lifesaving station that, having gained a reputation for saving lives, then deteriorates into a self-focussed social club. As a result, people die because members neglect their original reason for being.

In the second Clinebell recasts the parable offering a different scenario for the club. He imagines the lifesavers consulting with the wider community to enhance safety by providing more buoys and improving the lighthouse. Club members offer sailing and swimming lessons. Community engagement leads to the lifesavers looking beyond their immediate work to the wellbeing of the whole community including the provision of food to those in need through community gardens as well as exercise programs. Not only are lives saved but tragedies are averted and the wellbeing of the entire community is enhanced.

These parables challenge faith communities to resist the temptation to become self-serving holy clubs by continually seeking ways to engage with the wider community. In the course of prison ministry I am often asked "Where is your church on the outside?" I am proud to be able to tell them about St Peter's - both about the beauty of our worship and the quality of our social outreach. Some months ago, two of my work colleagues from the Melbourne Assessment Prison came to worship at High Mass. They still talk about the experience! Even so Clinebell's vision is one of ever-expanding horizons of care. As we contemplate new possibilities in ministry in this New Year I am reminded of a collect from An Australian Prayer Book (1978):

Let us pray [that the love of God may raise us beyond what we see to the unseen glory of his kingdom.]

God our Father,

May we love you in all things and above all things

And reach the joy you have prepared for us

Beyond all our imagining.

We ask this through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son,

Who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, forever and ever. Amen.

# Mass Readings

# First Reading: Isaiah 49.3, 5-6

The Lord said to me, "You are my servant, Israel, in whom I will be glorified." And now the Lord says, who formed me in the womb to be his servant, to bring Jacob back to him, and that Israel might be gathered to him, for I am honoured in the sight of the Lord, and my God has become my strength. He says, "It is too small a thing that you should be my servant to raise up the tribes of Jacob and to restore the survivors of Israel; I will give you as a light to the nations, that my salvation may reach to the end of the earth."

**Psalm**: 40.1+3a, 6, 7-8, 9



I waited patiently for the Lord; he inclined to me and heard my cry. He put a new song in my mouth, a song of praise to our God. R. Sacrifice and offering you do not desire, but you have given me an open ear. Burnt offering and sin offering you have not required. R. # Gospel Reading: John 1.29-34

John the Baptist saw Jesus coming toward him and declared, "Here is the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world! This is he of whom I said, 'After me comes a man who ranks ahead of me because he was before me.' I myself did not know him; but I came baptizing with water for this reason, that he might be revealed to Israel." And John testified, "I saw the Spirit descending from heaven like a dove, and it remained on him. I myself did not know him, but the one who sent me to baptize with water said to me, 'He on whom you see the Spirit descend and remain is the one who baptizes with the Holy Spirit.' And I myself have seen and have testified that this is the Son of God."


