

GATHERING IN GOD'S NAME

Mass setting: Missa de Angelis (Gregorian Mass XVIII).

Celebrant: In the name of the Father, + and of the Son

and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

The Lord be with you. **And also with you.**

The celebrant chants the collect for purity.

Let us pray: Almighty God, to whom all hearts are open, all desires known, and from whom no secrets are hidden: cleanse the thoughts of our hearts by the inspiration of your Holy Spirit, that we may perfectly love you, and worthily magnify your holy name, through Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

The cantor sings:

Kyrie eleison, Christe eleison, Kyrie eleison. Lord have mercy, Christ have mercy, Lord have mercy.

The celebrant introduces the confession:

Let us confess our sins in penitence and faith, confident in God's forgiveness.

Merciful God,
our maker and our judge,
we have sinned against you
in thought, word, and deed,
and in what we have failed to do:
we have not loved you with our whole heart;
we have not loved our neighbours as ourselves;
we repent and are sorry for all our sins.
Father, forgive us.
Strengthen us to love and obey you in newness of life;

through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

The celebrant pronounces the absolution:

Almighty God,

Who has promised forgiveness of sins to all those who turn to him in faith:

+ pardon you and set you free from all your sins, strengthen you in all goodness and keep you in eternal life, through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

The Gloria.

The celebrant chants the collect for the day.

God of freedom, you have broken the tyranny of sin

And sent the Spirit of your Son into our hearts:

Give us grace to dedicate our freedom to your service,

That all people may know the glorious liberty

Of the children of God;

Through Jesus Christ our Lord,

Who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit,

One God, now and for ever. Amen.

THE MINISTRY OF THE WORD


THE FIRST READING: Isaiah 22:15, 19-23

Thus says the Lord God of hosts: "Go to the steward, to Shebna, who is master of the household, and say to him: "I will thrust you from your office, and you will be pulled down from your post. On that day I will call my servant Eliakim son of Hilkiah, and will clothe him with your robe and bind your sash on him. I will commit your authority to his hand, and he shall be a father to the inhabitants of Jerusalem and to the house of Judah. "I will place on his shoulder the key of the house of David; he shall open, and no one shall shut; he shall shut, and no one shall open. I will fasten him like a peg in a secure place, and he will become a throne of honour to his ancestral house.

The cantor leads the singing of the Psalm. Please join in the response.




THE EPISTLE: Romans 11:33-36

THE GOSPEL: Matthew 16:13-20

The cantor leads the singing of the antiphon. Please join in the response.



The celebrant: The Lord be with you.

And also with you.

The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Matthew.

Glory to you + Lord Jesus Christ.

Now when Jesus came into the district of Caesarea Philippi, he asked his disciples, "Who do people say that the Son of Man is?" And they said, "Some say John the Baptist, but others Elijah, and still others Jeremiah or one of the prophets." He said to them, "But who do you say that I am?" Simon Peter answered, "You are the Messiah, the Son of the living God." And Jesus answered him, "Blessed are you, Simon son of Jonah! For flesh and blood has not revealed this to you, but my Father in heaven. And I tell you, you are Peter, and on this rock I will build my church, and the gates of Hades will not prevail against it. I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven, and whatever you bind on earth will be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth will be loosed in heaven." Then Jesus sternly ordered the disciples not to tell anyone that he was the Messiah.

THE GREETING OF THE PEACE

Celebrant: We are the body of Christ.

His Spirit is with us.

The peace of the Lord be always with you.

And also with you.

The cantor sings a motet as the altar is prepared.

Celebrant: Blessed are you . . . Blessed be God forever.

Pray, my brothers and sisters, that our sacrifice may be acceptable to God, the Almighty Father.

May the Lord accept this sacrifice at your hands

to the praise and glory of his name,

for our good and the good of all his Church.

THE GREAT THANKSGIVING

Celebrant: The Lord be with you.

And also with you. Lift up your hearts.

We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. It is right to give our thanks and praise.

The celebrant continues the prayer of Great Thanksgiving, leading to:

Celebrant: ... forever praising you and saying:

Sanctus, Sanctus, Sanctus Dominus Deus Sabaoth.

Pleni sunt caeli et terra gloria tua.

Hosanna in excelsis. Benedictus qui venit in nomine domini. Hosanna in excelsis Holy, holy, holy


God of power and might, heaven and earth are full

The celebrant continues the prayer, leading to:

Celebrant: Let us proclaim the mystery of faith ...




Celebrant: We worship you, Father Almighty,

in songs of never-ending praise.



Bles sing and ho-nour and glo-ry and power are yours_for e-ver and_ e - ver. A - men.

Celebrant: As our Saviour Christ has taught us,



For the king - dom, the power, and the glo - ry are yours now and for e - ver. A - men.

Celebrant: We who are many are one body, for we all share in the one bread.

All remaining kneeling as the cantor sings:

Agnus Dei, Lamb of God,

qui tollis peccata mundi: you take away the sin of the world:

miserere nobis. have mercy on us.

Agnus Dei, Lamb of God,

qui tollis peccata mundi: you take away the sin of the world:

dona nobis pacem. grant us your peace.

Celebrant: Behold the Lamb of God,

who takes away the sins of the world.

Blessed are those who are called to his supper.

Lord, I am not worthy to receive you,

but only say the word and I shall be healed.

The Sacrament is shared amongst those present. The cantor sings a motet. At the conclusion of Holy Communion all are invited to join in singing the hymn:

The celebrant chants the post-communion prayer:

Father, we offer ourselves to you as a living sacrifice through Jesus Christ our Lord.
Send us out in the power of your Spirit to live and work to your praise and glory.

The blessing: The peace of God ... And the blessing ...

The celebrant dismisses the congregation.

Go in peace to love and serve the Lord:

In the name of Christ. Amen.
