

My catch phrase always used to be: "never a dull day at The Hill." Well, things don't change, even in time of pandemic! Many of us are excitedly awaiting this coming Tuesday evening, at 7pm, when the new Archbishop of York, the Most Rev'd Stephen Cottrell, will be our guest speaker at the St Peter's Winter Webinar. Bishop Stephen, as he was then, was our Parish Missioner in 2015, and won the hearts and minds of many parishioners. He will be well worth listening to. This week we received the most amazing news about our Klingner Scholarship program: a philanthropist decided to donate \$100,000. In December 1975 St Peter's Parishioner, Harold Klingner, died and left a generous bequest to the parish in support of those training for the priesthood. The Trustees have carefully managed the corpus over the years, and it now provides a scholarship and traiing opportunity each year to ordinands and others exploring a call to the priesthood. This year's Klingner Scholar is Xeverie Swee. It has been a challenging first year for Xeverie, as Melbourne went into lock-down soon after she commenced her scholarship, but Xeverie has risen to the challenge, and embraced on-



line ministry at St Peter's. She assists our Lay Minister, Alae, in the Zoom Rosary sessions, as well as offering several Thought for the Day reflections (<a href="https://youtu.be/0Li4L8Bd4RY">https://youtu.be/0Li4L8Bd4RY</a>) and just last week Xeverie delivered her first sermon (<a href="https://bit.ly/2Q9jO4w">https://bit.ly/2Q9jO4w</a>). This week's incredibly generous donation will enable us to continue to develop this hands-on ordination training program for many more generations to come.

Another exciting ministry development at St Peter's this week has been the launch of our "Heaven at The Hill" social enterprise barista training program. Through the social enterprise meals program, we now have 30 student volunteers, and each weekday 40 or 50 students trek up the hill to pick up food-relief packages. As well as a hand-out, we are keen to give a hand-up, and so have developed a training program, up-skilling our volunteers and other students in the art of making a great coffee. We are most grateful to all those who donated so generously to this year's St Peter's Charitable Foundation Annual Appeal. Because of your generosity, the Foundation has been able to purchase a coffee machine for the social enterprise. When we are once again allowed to gather as a parish, I will make sure that some of the graduates of Heaven at The Hill's "Good Coffee" training program make you a coffee!






### AN EVENING WITH THE ARCHBISHOP OF YORK

## FOUNDATION ANNUAL APPEAL - PLANS FOR THE FUTURE -

Following on from the recent success of the Foundation Annual Appeal, the Foundation is pleased to report on the use of some of those funds. We are planning to create an under-cover area for use by the Social Enterprise and Lazarus Centre, through the installation of retractable glass doors at the end of the Parish Hall under the balcony. Some of the funds raised in the appeal will support this. These doors will enable provision of a separate area that will have a number of uses, most importantly a cafe space for the Social Enterprise, and an area for our Lazarus Centre participants to have breakfast, once normal processes can return.

While we still hope that at some future point we will be able to proceed with our long-standing plans to cover the courtyard between the church and the hall, given the impact of COVID-19, this may be some time away. The glass doors partition, in the meantime, will provide a more immediate and low cost solution, without in any way changing or interfering with existing usage of the full hall. The partition is easily folded in or out as need dictates. At times of the day when it is not used by the Social Entrprise or the Lazrus Centre, the separated area may be used by other community groups.

The space will also be available for use after Sunday Masses, once things return to normality. In addition, we have invested in the purchase of a reconditioned coffee machine which will be used to assist in training our Social Enterprise volunteers to work in both the Coffee Caravan and a proposed cafe. It will also be available for parishioners at other time, booked through the Parish Office.

The remainder of the Annual Appeal funds will be used to support the direct relief work of both the Lazarus Centre and the Social Enterprise, helping the homeless, the unemployed and others in necessitous circumstances.


#### - OBITUARY -

Willoughby (Will) James Bailey AO (1933 – 2020)

Will Bailey, St Peter's Parishioner of many years, died on Friday 14th August.

Will Bailey had a long and successful career in banking and finance, culminating in being the CEO of the ANZ Banking Group from 1984 - 1992. He was deeply involved in charitable work, which reflected his Christian faith and a strong commitment to helping the less fortunate. As a member of the order of St Lazarus, he was a benefactor of the Chapel of St Lazarus and did much to implement the Order's Green Cross project assisting homeless people in inner Melbourne. He was still on the advisory board of CARE Australia at the time of his death.

His service to the community was reflected in his appointment as an Officer of the Order of Australia. Will was a long standing and active parishioner at



St Peter's. He served on the Parish Council and as a Churchwarden, and advised the Parish about its investments. He was one of the main people involved in setting up the St Peter's Eastern Hill Charitable Foundation in 1999, and was one of its inaugural trustees. He did this to provide focus and structure to the Parish's charitable activities and fundraising, including the breakfast program, the better to assist people "in necessitous circumstances" (as the Trust Deed says). He was a key person in facilitating and enabling the visits to Canberra of our then Vicar, Bp David Farrer, to lobby for significant funding from the Federal Government for our work with the homeless.

Will died in hospital on 12 August following a fall at his home, with his loving and much loved wife Dorothy at his side. Our thoughts and prayers are with her, their daughters Alison, Robyn and Merryn and their families.


