### A Word or Two from Fr Graeme

Dear Friends of St Peter's,

The month of August brings a marvellously broad Calendar with Stephen, protomartyr (translated), the Curé d'Ars, Oswald, the Transfiguration, Holy Name Day, Bartholomew and many others. Stephen demonstrates the power of the Great Commitment, the Curé is a model for every parish priest; Oswald is an exemplar of loyalty; the Transfiguration reveals to us the destiny of all; Holy Name Day reminds us of the sanctity of our own baptismal name; and Bartholomew's patronage of tanners, plasterers, tailors, leatherworkers, bookbinders, farmers, housepainters, butchers, and glove makers, reminds us that what you are is God's gift to you, what you become is your gift to God

If only we had (or made) time to reflect on the vast arena of gifts and godliness around us. We are often confronted by images of worldliness, sin and despair. Yet into our very ordinary lives God places his saints and his feasts to encourage us in our own spiritual pilgrimage.

We often allow ourselves to be 'side-tracked' by things and events that are really of very little importance and of no value at all to the Kingdom. We allow some things to overwhelm us and we so easily give up on our faith. We have many examples of godly living right here in our own parish family, many examples of holiness and devotion, too. Devotion and life-style cannot be divorced. We also have a precious environment in which to worship, to meditate, to give thanks and to intercede. It is a great comfort to know that whenever we kneel to pray we do so with a great company of others whose lives have been 'made perfect'. We must encourage one another in all our various ministries. The miracle of the loaves and fishes tells us whose side God is on.

St. Peter's has been and will continue (pray God) to be a significant place in the life of the Church in Melbourne. We are passing through a very important stage in our life at the moment – though it is not always easy to discern such 'moments' – and a time when the catholic faith of the Anglican Church is under all kinds of creative pressures – an exciting time really, if we lift up our eyes to the wider world of need around us.

It is relatively easy for such places as St. Peter's to proclaim Faith. We have a great Liturgy, glorious music and many dedicated and talented people.



## Mass Readings

#### First Reading: Isaiah 66.18-21

Thus says the Lord: "For I know their works and their thoughts, and I am coming to gather all nations and tongues; and they shall come and shall see my glory, and I will set a sign among them. From them I will send survivors to the nations, to Tarshish, Put, and Lud—which draw the bow— to Tubal and Javan, to the coastlands far away that have not heard of my fame or seen my glory; and they shall declare my glory among the nations. They shall bring all your kindred from all the nations as an offering to the Lord, on horses, and in chariots, and in litters, and on mules, and on dromedaries, to my holy mountain Jerusalem, says the Lord, just as the Israelites bring a grain offering in a clean vessel to the house of the Lord. And I will also take some of them as priests and as Levites," says the Lord.

#### Second Reading: Hebrews 12.5-7, 11-13

And you have forgotten the exhortation that addresses you as children—"My child, do not regard lightly the discipline of the Lord, or lose heart when you are punished by him; for the Lord disciplines those whom he loves, and chastises every child whom he accepts. Endure trials for the sake of discipline. God is treating you as children; for what child is there whom a parent does not discipline? Now, discipline always seems painful rather than pleasant at the time, but later it yields the peaceful fruit of righteousness to those who have been trained by it. Therefore lift your drooping hands and strengthen your weak knees, and make straight paths for your feet, so that what is lame may not be put out of joint, but rather be healed.

#### **Gospel:** Luke 13.22-30

Jesus went through one town and village after another, teaching as he made his way to Jerusalem. Someone asked him, "Lord, will only a few be saved?" Jesus said to them, "Strive to enter through the narrow door; for many, I tell you, will try to enter and will not be able. When once the owner of the house has got up and shut the door, and you begin to stand outside and to knock at the door, saying, 'Lord, open to us,' then in reply he will say to you, 'I do not know where you come from.' Then you will begin to say, 'We ate and drank with you, and you taught in our streets.' But the Lord will say, 'I do not know where you come from; go away from me, all you evildoers!' There will be weeping and gnashing of teeth when you see Abraham and Isaac and Jacob and all the prophets in the kingdom of God, and you yourselves thrown out. Then people will come from east and west, from north and south, and will eat in the kingdom of God. Indeed, some are last who will be first, and some are first who will be last."


This week St Peter's Bookroom sold books and represented St Peter's at the Barry Marshall lecture at Trinity Theological College.
