Vicar's Musings

Today we mark a significant retirement and two new appointments in the St Peter's Eastern Hill Guild of Servers. At our morning Masses today we will honour our Head Server of many years, Peter Bryce, on his retirement from this position of leadership in the church. Peter first started attending St Peter's in his mother's womb. He then joined the Servers' Guild at the age of five, under his father's and Fr Maynard's tutelage. Since then Peter has held every role possible in the Guild, and of recent decades has led the team as Head Server. Peter is one of the most highly esteemed elders of St Peter's church; a capable, gentle, loyal, humble and hugely intelligent man; a pillar of our faith community. On Peter's retirement, and in recognition of his service to St Peter's for most of his lifetime, I will be appointing him to a newly created position: Patron of the Servers' Guild. Peter will continue to serve in the Sanctuary as a member of the Guild, and has graciously agreed to continue to assist me as Vicar with various liturgical tasks.

At our Masses today I will also be appointing Anthony Schepis as the new Head Server. Anthony has been a member of the Servers' Guild himself for many years, working his way up the ranks from torchbearer to M.C. He too is highly respected in our Church and among the Guild of Servers. They are big shoes to fill, however, so a huge thank-you to Anthony for rising to the challenge.

BOOK FAIR – SATURDAY 14TH AND SUNDAY 15TH SEPTEMBER 2019



Mass Readings

First Reading: Wisdom 9.13-18

For who can learn the counsel of God? Or who can discern what the Lord wills? For the reasoning of mortals is worthless, and our designs are likely to fail; for a perishable body weighs down the soul, and this earthy tent burdens the thoughtful mind. We can hardly guess at what is on earth, and what is at hand we find with labour; but who has traced out what is in the heavens? Who has learned your counsel, unless you have given wisdom and sent your holy spirit from on high? And thus the paths of those on earth were set right, and people were taught what pleases you, and were saved by wisdom.

Psalm: 90.3-4, 5-6, 12-13, 14+17



You turn us back to dust, and say, "Turn back, you mortals." For a thousand years in your sight are like yesterday when it is past, R. or like a watch in the night. You sweep them away; they are like a dream, like grass that is renewed in the morning; in the morning it flourishes and is renewed; in the evening it fades and withers. R. So teach us to count our days that we may gain a wise heart. Turn, O Lord! How long? Have compassion on your servants! R. Satisfy us in the morning with your steadfast love, so that we may rejoice and be glad all our days. Let the favour of the Lord our God be upon us, and prosper for us the work of our hands. R.

Second Reading: Philemon 9b-10, 12-17

I, Paul, do this as an old man, and now also as a prisoner of Christ Jesus. I am appealing to you for my child, Onesimus, whose father I have become during my imprisonment. I am sending him, that is, my own heart, back to you. I wanted to keep him with me, so that he might be of service to me in your place during my imprisonment for the gospel; but I preferred to do nothing without your consent, in order that your good deed might be voluntary and not something forced. Perhaps this is the reason he was separated from you for a while, so that you might have him back forever, no longer as a slave but more than a slave, a beloved brother— especially to me but how much more to you, both in the flesh and in the Lord. So if you consider me your partner, welcome him as you would welcome me.

Gospel: Luke 14.25-33

Large crowds were traveling with Jesus; and he turned and said to them, "Whoever comes to me and does not hate father and mother, spouse and children, brothers and sisters, yes, and even life itself, cannot be my disciple. Whoever does not carry the cross and follow me cannot be my disciple. For which of you, intending to build a tower, does not first sit down and estimate the cost, to see whether he has enough to complete it? Otherwise, when he has laid a foundation and is not able to finish, all who see it will begin to ridicule him, saying, "This fellow began to build and was not able to finish." Or what king, going out to wage war against another king, will not sit down first and consider whether he is able with ten thousand to oppose the one who comes against him with twenty thousand? If he cannot, then, while the other is still far away, he sends a delegation and asks for the terms of peace. So therefore, none of you can become my disciple if you do not give up all your possessions."






