

Vicar's Musings

The political balance of the Diocese of Melbourne reached a tipping point at this year's Synod, as evidenced by the passing of two motions by a slim majority in opposition to the blessing of same-sex relationships. St Peter's Eastern Hill has long been a church that welcomes and values the ministry of LGBTI people, both ordained and lay, and numerous parishioners I have spoken to since Synod are deeply saddened by this shift in the Diocese.

The 2015 Annual Meeting of our Parish, for example, passed the following resolution without a single opposing vote: "Noting (a) That Changing Attitude Australia was established to move forward the debate about human sexuality in the Anglican Church and beyond; (b) That Changing Attitude Australia has invited parishes to identify themselves as 'Welcoming Congregations'; this designation is intended to signal that the congregation is one where gay, lesbian, bisexual, transgender and intersex people can be guaranteed a welcome; that this Annual Meeting confirms St Peter's membership of Changing Attitude Australia and reaffirms our wish to be designated as a 'Welcoming Congregation." Then, in 2017, Parish Council responded to the postal survey on marriage equality by passing a resolution that noted the contribution made by LGBTI parishioners to the parish, while deploring hateful attacks on the LGBTI community that the postal survey had enabled, and expressing support for the "Yes" vote.

Earlier this month, addressing the Synod of the Diocese of Sydney, Archbishop Glenn Davies told Anglican supporters of same-sex marriage that they should leave the church rather than "betray God's word." Ironically, just five months earlier, Archbishop Davies had officiated at the schismatic consecration of Jay Behan as bishop of the break-away "Church of Confessing Anglicans Aotearoa/New Zealand." To the anger and disbelief of nearly two hundred Melbourne Synod Reps last week, there was a slim majority (~230 to 190) who voted to welcome: "the formation of the Church of Confessing Anglicans Aotearoa/New Zealand." A similar slim majority also successfully moved: "That this Synod expresses its sorrow to the Bishop and Synod of the Diocese of Wangaratta for their approval of a liturgy that could be used to bless persons in same-sex relationships at their recent Synod meeting."

Fr Craig D'Alton, the Vicar of Christ Church South Yarra, and former Curate at St Peter's Eastern Hill, delivered a powerful call-to-arms in a recent sermon entitled "Remember Lot's wife" (see http://humanecatholic.blogspot.com). He concludes: "let us admit what is, frankly, a missional and pastoral disaster unfolding in this diocese." The question for us here at St Peter's, and in other like-minded faithful progressive Anglican parishes is: what are we going to do?

REQUIEM MASS FOR GINA MACPHERSON - WED 30TH OCT, 1:15PM



Mass Readings

First Reading: Sirach 35.15-17, 20-22

The Lord is the judge, and with him there is no partiality. He will not show partiality to the poor but he will listen to the prayer of one who is wronged. The Lord will not ignore the supplication of the orphan, or the widow when she pours out her complaint. The one whose service is pleasing to the Lord will be accepted, and the prayer of such a person will reach to the clouds. The prayer of the humble pierces the clouds, and it will not rest until it reaches its goal; it will not desist until the Most High responds and does justice for the righteous, and executes judgment. Indeed, the Lord will not delay.

Psalm: 34.1-2, 16-17, 18+22 (R.6)



I will bless the Lord at all times;
his praise shall continually be in my mouth.

Second Reading: 2 Timothy 4.6-8, 16-18

As for me, I am already being poured out as a libation, and the time of my departure has come. I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith. From now on there is reserved for me the crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous judge, will give me on that day, and not only to me but also to all who have longed for his appearing. At my first defense no one came to my support, but all

deserted me. May it not be counted against them! But the Lord stood by me and gave me strength, so that through me the message might be fully proclaimed and all the Gentiles might hear it. So I was rescued from the lion's mouth. The Lord will rescue me from every evil attack and save me for his heavenly kingdom. To him be the glory forever and ever. Amen.

Gospel: Luke 18.9-14

Jesus told this parable to some who trusted in themselves that they were righteous, and regarded others with contempt: "Two men went up to the temple to pray, one a Pharisee and the other a tax collector. The Pharisee, standing by himself, was praying thus, 'God, I thank you that I am not like other people: thieves, rogues, adulterers, or even like this tax collector. I fast twice a week; I give a tenth of all my income.' But the tax collector, standing far off, would not even look up to heaven, but was beating his breast and saying, 'God, be merciful to me, a sinner!' I tell you, this man went down to his home justified rather than the other; for all who exalt themselves will be humbled, but all who humble themselves will be exalted."
