

Annual Meeting of the Parish, after 10am High Mass, on Sunday 24th November

I hope you can join us for the Annual Meeting of the Parish, on the feast day of "Christ the King." After the 10am Parish High Mass, with Children's Church, there will be a complimentary light lunch before our meeting.

Also, in my Musings last week I wrote about the disturbing decision of this year's Melbourne Synod to welcome the actions of several rogue bishops in illegally consecrating a schismatic bishop in New Zealand, and the lack of support for the Diocese of Wangaratta in their Synodical approval – according to due process – of a liturgy that could be used to bless persons in same-sex relationships.

Following up from this, your Parish Council has passed a motion that we have posted on our web site: https://www.stpeters.org.au/pc-motion-2019. We encourage you to read over it, ahead of the Annual Meeting, where it will be an agenda item. In summary, the motion affirms the Parish Council position over several years on the full inclusion of LGBTIQA+ people, underpinned by our belief of the Real Presence of Christ both in sacramental forms and the community of the faithful. For those within our church community who are struggling in the light of recent events, you do not struggle alone. I encourage you to reach out to me, to the Wardens and to Parish Council members, as well as seeking support within the wider community. At St Peter's we thank God for the diversity of gifts and graces within the Body of Christ, and the beautiful variety of peoples, interests and activities that are represented throughout the whole people of God.

PARKING IN THE PARISH ON SUNDAY 10TH NOVEMBER



Mass Readings

First Reading: Wisdom 11.22 - 12.2

The whole world before you, O Lord, is like a speck that tips the scales, and like a drop of morning dew that falls on the ground. But you are merciful to all, for you can do all things, and you overlook people's sins, so that they may repent. Lord, you love all things that exist, and detest none of the things that you have made, for you would not have made anything if you had hated it. How would anything have endured if you had not willed it? Or how would anything not called forth by you have been preserved? You spare all things, for they are yours, O Lord, you who love the living. He was trying to see who Jesus was, but on account of the crowd he could not, because he was short in stature. So he ran ahead and climbed a sycamore tree to see Jesus, because he was going to pass that way. When Jesus came to the place, he looked up and said to him, "Zacchaeus, hurry and come down; for I must stay at your house today." So Zacchaeus hurried down and was happy to welcome Jesus. All who saw it began to grumble and said, "He has gone to be the guest of one who is a sinner." Zacchaeus stood there and said to the Lord, "Look, half of my possessions, Lord, I will give to the poor; and if I have defrauded anyone of anything, I will pay back four times as much." Then Jesus said of him, "Today salvation has come to this house, because Zacchaeus too is a son of Abraham. For the Son of Man came to seek out and to save the lost."





Foundations of Anglican Evangelicalism in Victoria: Four Elements for Continuity, 1847-1937

For more than half a century, the Anglican Diocese of Melbourne was unquestionably the most rigorously evangelical and missions-oriented diocese in Australia. The Diocese of Sydney, in that same period, was decidedly broader in theological and liturgical practice. How and why did Melbourne move in one direction, while Sydney in the other?



This study suggests that the answers are to be found in four vital contributors: local churches, evangelical societies, theological colleges, and diocesan bishops. For three broad pe-

riods of history between 1847 and 1937, the presence of these four contributors is uncovered, described, and evaluated for the Diocese of Melbourne. Evangelical activism, theological reflection, and leadership are each shown in their contemporary contexts to help us understand how people with gospel passion sought to respond faithfully to their times.
