

High responds and does justice for the righteous, and executes judgment. Indeed, the Lord will not delay.



At 9.30am the Sanctus is said and at 11.00am the choir sings the Sanctus.



THE ANGELUS

At 11.00am only The Angelus is led and sung by the Celebrant. The church bell rings three times during the recitation of the Hail Mary, and nine times during the final Collect.

WEEKLY REFLECTIONS

Reflections for Stewardship Sunday – from Stephen Duckett

I've just got back from six weeks in Europe, part holiday, part work. This was my first overseas trip since early 2020 because of the pandemic. I had a great time but coming back and sleeping in my own bed was good too. One of the things I missed was St Peter's. There is nothing like being present at the Mass and catching up afterwards for 'coffee'.

In this era of individualism, we forget that humans are born to be social, each person is a person-in-community, with St Peter's being an important community for all of us.

Christianity is not a solo faith, it is a faith practised in community. Sure, we can be nurtured through individual prayer, individual reading and reflection, and individual contemplation. But Jesus promised us he would be present whenever two or three are gathered in his name. We are all nurtured by being together, singing together, praying together, and fellowship together after the Mass. We are specially nurtured in taking the Eucharist together, with the common cup being a demonstrable manifestation of our unity together and with Christ.

But just as we are nurtured in this parish today, we must also nurture and support the parish to nurture us and others. We employ a priest, musicians, and other staff. We heat the church and the hall. We keep our buildings in good shape, thankfully no longer leaking water when it rains. All of that costs money, and money that can only come from us today, or from bequests left us in the past.

We have aspirations to do more in 2023. Parish Council wants to support a second priest – to support Fr Michael and be supported by Fr Michael – but also supported by all of us as they develop their faith and skills. It is particularly important for parishes like ours to nurture new priests to ensure that there are opportunities for new priests in the Catholic tradition who preach a broad and inclusive faith.

So we are asking you today to think about your contributions to our special Christian community here at St Peter's. Luckily, we've had some generous parishioners in the past who left us bequests which give us an income to supplement what current parishioners give, but each year these capital funds shrink a little as we continue to live beyond our means. Last year the parish ran at a deficit with the pandemic being part of the reason. We should aim to balance our budget this year to avoid abusing


the generosity of parishioners in ages past. If we are to achieve a balanced budget, and hire a second full-time priest, we will all need to increase our contributions.

Parish Council has taken a punt that we will increase our giving and have set in train the steps to get a new priest early next year. Let us not disappoint.

We all love St Peter's. The parish nurtures us and gives us joy. The parish also has a wider remit in the diocese which we need to support.

As we enter the 2023 church year we should do so boldly, having established a firm financial foundation to ensure that our mission — both locally and more broadly — can be enhanced and achieved. And this needs your help. We don't ask for money often, it is a hard thing for any of us to do so, but it is also a reality that we need those extra resources to continue and to grow.
