

Vicar's Musings

STOP PRESS: don't forget, daylight saving ends at 3am on Sunday 5th April. An extra hour in bed!

It is easy to sink into despair in these worrying times. There is no escaping the reality that contagion, and the death toll from the COVID-19 virus is growing rapidly across the world; and our response to this as individuals and as a church is vitally important. But life does go on, and concern about the pandemic should not fill our every waking moment. Indeed, unchecked fear and anxiety can do great damage itself to our body, mind and soul.

Although not one of our readings for Palm Sunday, I have found it helpful this week to meditate on the life-giving words in St Paul's letter to his fledgling church in Philippi: "Beloved, whatever is true, whatever is honourable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is pleasing, whatever is commendable, if there is any excellence and if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things" Philippians 4:8.

At the start of this week I realised that I was becoming addicted to the news. Rather than turning off the TV after I had caught up with the latest headlines, ABC News 24 was running continuously for more than half the day at home. Over breakfast, morning tea, lunch, and in the evening, I was checking on the latest bulletin. And then, when I had a moment, I would dig deeper through Auntie Google or Uncle Facebook. This week I have intentionally stopped doing this. I can really get all the news I need, across the various platforms, in half an hour, once or twice a day.

The news I've spent much more time on this week, has been what is going on for St Peter's parishioners, as you face self-isolation, work from home, and respond to the crisis professionally and personally. My favourite news story this week, is from one of our 8am congregation members. In an e-mail I said that I was missing his stories over breakfast after Mass. He replied: "Today's CDM tale: I felt very pleased with myself last Saturday in the Coles checkout queue, armed with a big toilet roll packet. A little old lady behind me asked, 'Are they for your grandchildren?' I had to quickly return the packet of nappies to the shelves."

Other news that you might be interested in, is how St Peter's Eastern Hill is adapting to this new COVID-19 era. Our congregations are shut out of the church building, and spread across Melbourne, but there are lots of different ways that we are remaining connected, and reinventing what it means to be "church."

With gatherings of only two people now allowed, the Palm Sunday Mass liturgy this year will be led by the celebrant and organist alone. No servers, no choir, no readers and intercessors, no sidespeople, no welcomers or hospitality volunteers.
