# WEEKLY MUSINGS

When I was very young, on Sunday evenings my mum used to make beef sandwiches from the remnants of our roast lunch. Sometimes, when she had fabric left over from making a dress, she would sew the remnants together into a half apron. Discarded wool became handy for knitting a scarf. The left overs, the remainders were never thrown out but used to make something new.

The readings this morning are about restoration after breakage and separation - gathering in of the remnants. Christ, Love-bearer, is the shepherd who gathers all into the fold. Those who feel dislocated or in exile are shown to be a new beginning for the whole. The prophet Jeremiah, in his most acerbic voice, accuses the spiritual shepherds of his day for scattering and neglecting the people of Israel. But at the same time assures the flock that even in this state God will not forsake them. He will gather the 'remnant of my flock.' In Psalm 23, the Lord is the true Shepherd, who leads, who heals, who accompanies in 'deaths dark vale.' In Mark's Gospel, Jesus shows great compassion for the crowd who are 'like a sheep without a shepherd.' These are passages about people who are lost, disconnected from the social and cultural centre, who can't find a way. Readings very pertinent for our times.

Today, 18th July, the Jewish Calendar marks Tisha B'Av. It's a day of Observance which commemorates many disasters in Jewish history, including the destruction of the First and Second Temple. Jewish peoples have suffered much persecution and tragedy over the millennia. The Hebrew word for remnant is 'sheerith', a word used in this morning's reading of Jeremiah, and many times by the prophets Ezekial and Isaiah in terms of the exile of Jewish people. Sh'erit ha-Pletah is Hebrew for 'surviving remnant' a phrase occurring in the Book of Ezra and Chronicles. In the late 1940s over 250 000 Jewish Holocaust survivors lived in Displaced Persons camps. A group calling themselves the Sh'erit ha-Pletah was formed and for nearly 6 years this diverse group of Jews coming from almost every corner of Europe sought to improve the conditions of the camps and find a new unity amongst themselves. Individuals who had lost everything began to make a new life and sought immigration in particular to Israel.

Around us today are many who know how it feels to be looked over, discarded. Thousands of people seek asylum to live in Australian community. 1 in 5 young people are struggling with mental health. At the height of the Covid-19 crisis in Australia, March - June last year, nationally about 6 000 people each month sought out services for homelessness, an increase in Victoria by 27%.

Christ moved most often not amongst those at the centre but at the edges. Socially and economically people can be relegated the status of remnant. But in these readings, we are reminded that in Christ no person is a leftover. Each of us holds a seed for a new beginning. Each of us is asked to work for restoration and wholeness.




For decades Melbourne churches have been looking to our "big sister" in London, St Martins in the Fields for inspiration and ideas.


