WEEKLY MUSINGS

The Holy Trinity

John Donne memorably wrote, "O Blessed glorious Trinity, Bones to Philosophy, but milk to faith."

Over the years the Trinity has seemed to some (to many?) to be theory about God, the result of theologians complicating faith. God the Holy Trinity is, in fact, the statement of experience which is at the heart of the notion of community and the deeper mystique of life.

Words are inadequate to describe the doctrine of the Trinity. There are, however, still preachers out there who will regale us with triangles and interlocking hoops or mathematical formulae which inevitably end up by robbing God of mystery, majesty, and glory. It has been said by Evelyn Underhill, "'If God were small enough to be understood, He would not be big enough to be worshipped."

"There is a very old and much-repeated story about St Augustine. While walking on the beach he saw a small boy pouring sea water from a shell into a small hole in the sand. "What are you doing, my child?" asked Augustine. "I am emptying the sea into this hole," the boy answered with an innocent smile. "But that is impossible, my dear child," said Augustine. The boy stood up, looked straight into the eyes of Augustine, and replied, "What you are trying to do—comprehend the immensity of God with your small head—is even more impossible." There are many preachers who are fearful of preaching on this Sunday, and I have lost count of the number of times over the years that I have been inundated with requests to preach on Trinity Sunday.

Jane Williams, wife of the former Archbishop of Canterbury, has written, "In times past the doctrine of the Trinity has sometimes appeared as the kind of mad relation beloved of Victorian era authors. Generally kept locked up in the attic, but occasionally escaping to alarm the unsuspecting visitor".

Bishop Graeme Rutherford, in a sermon some years ago said,

"If God was a simple, single, undifferentiated being there would be no such thing as relationship and therefore no love. A person, who spends his or her whole life in a room alone, has no experience of love from a human point of view, because there is no relationship. But the Trinity means that before the universe came into being there is relationship and therefore at the heart of everything there is love."

The joy of the Trinity is love in diversity, unity-in-diversity. We have a God who welcomes us and includes us. The vision of society and the Church is one that can embrace difference and yet hold together in unity. That is a message we all need to reflect upon.






