

TRINITY SUNDAY

30^{TH} May 2021 - Liturgy

Almighty and everlasting God, you have given to us your servants grace by the confession of a true faith to acknowledge the glory of the eternal Trinity, and in the power of the divine majesty to worship the Unity: keep us steadfast in this faith, and evermore defend us from all adversities, for you live and reign, one God, for ever and ever. *Amen*

GATHERING IN GOD'S NAME

Prelude: T. Tallis (1505 - 85) Gloria tibi Trinitas

Mass setting: P. Carmody Missa Simplex

The sanctuary party enters the chancel. The celebrant commences incensing of the altar.

INTROIT

Antiphon: Blessed be the Holy Trinity and its undivided Unity; we shall ever give him thanks, for he has dealt with us according to his mercy.

O Lord, our Governor, how admirable is your name in all the earth! Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit etc. A.

Celebrant:

In the name of the Father, + and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.** The Lord be with you. **And also with you.**

The celebrant chants the collect for purity. The cantor chants:

Lord have mercy Christ have mercy Lord have mercy

The deacon introduces the confession:

Merciful God: Our maker and our judge, we have sinned against you in thought, word, and deed, and in what we have failed to do: we have not loved you with our whole heart; we have not loved our neighbours as ourselves; we repent and are sorry for all our sins. Father, forgive us. Strengthen us to love and obey you in newness of life; Through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

The celebrant pronounces the absolution. Please then stand for the Gloria:

Glory to God in the highest,

And on earth peace to men of good will,

We praise you,

We bless you,

We adore you,

We glorify you.

We give you thanks for your great glory.

Lord God, heavenly King,

O God, almighty Father,

Lord Jesus Christ,

Only Begotten Son,

Lord God, Lamb of God, Son of the Father.

You take away the Sins of the world, have mercy on us, You take away the Sins of the world, receive our prayer You are seated at the right hand of the Father, have mercy on us. For you alone are the Holy One, you alone are the Lord You alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ, With the Holy Spirit, + In the glory of God the Father, Amen.

The celebrant chants the collect. Please then sit for the readings.

THE MINISTRY OF THE WORD

DEUTERONOMY 4.32-34, 39-40

Moses assembled the people to remind them how the Lord had spoken out of the fire while they stood at the foot of the mountain. He said: "Ask now about former ages, long before your own, ever since the day that God created human beings on the earth; ask from one end of heaven to the other: 'has anything so great as this ever happened or has its like ever been heard of?' "Has any people ever heard the voice of a god speaking out of a fire, as you have heard, and lived? Or has any god ever attempted to go and take a nation for himself from the midst of another nation, by trials, by signs and wonders, by war, by a mighty hand and an outstretched arm, and by terrifying displays of power, as the Lord your God did for you in Egypt before your very eyes? So acknowledge today and take to heart that the Lord is God in heaven above and on the earth beneath; there is no other. Keep his statutes and his commandments, which I am commanding you today for your own well-being and that of your descendants after you, so that you may long remain in the land that the Lord your God is giving you for all time."

Hear the word of the Lord. Thanks be to God.

PSALM 33 led by the cantor, please join in the refrain.



The word of the Lord is upright, and all his work is done in faithfulness. He loves righteousness and justice; the earth is full of the steadfast love of the Lord. **R.**

By the word of the Lord the heavens were made,

and all their host by the breath of his mouth. For he spoke, and it came to be; he commanded, and it stood firm. **R.**

Truly the eye of the Lord is on those who fear him, on those who hope in his steadfast love, to deliver their souls from death, and to keep them alive in famine. **R**.

Our soul waits for the Lord; he is our help and shield. Let your steadfast love, O Lord, be upon us, even as we hope in you. **R**

ROMANS 8.14-17

All who are led by the Spirit of God are children of God. For you did not receive a spirit of slavery to fall back into fear, but you have received a spirit of adoption. When we cry, "Abba! Father!" it is that very Spirit bearing witness with our spirit that we are children of God, and if children, then heirs, heirs of God and joint heirs with Christ. The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Matthew (Matthew 28.16-20) + Glory to you, Lord Jesus Christ.




Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you. "And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age."


This is the Gospel of the Lord. Praise to you Lord Jesus Christ.



COMMUNION ANTIPHON
