

## Vicar's Musings

"Almighty" is a traditional divine descriptor in our prayer and liturgy that roles off the tongue. Of course it is theologically true, God is indeed all-mighty; but the question is how is that might expressed? And this is where we so often go wrong as Christians. God's power is not the same as worldly power. The Crusades or the Inquisition are obvious examples of this, when the medieval Church got it so profoundly wrong, confusing gospel mission for military conquest and coercion. If we are honest with ourselves, we all make this mistake, in less obvious ways, in our personal lives and in church life.

I was counselling a young man some time ago, and he broke down in tears. "I hate being so weak," he sobbed. "Showing emotion and vulnerability is the exact opposite of weakness," I replied. "It takes guts to go into that place. To explore it. To face up to realities you may not have yet seen in yourself and others. To own mistakes. To seek and offer forgiveness. To be open to divine healing grace."


In his book *The Divine Dance: The Trinity and Your Transformation* (SPCK, 2016) Franciscan Priest and Theologian Richard Rohr writes: "Did you ever imagine that what we call 'vulnerability' might just be the key to ongoing growth? ... If and when we can live such a vulnerable life, without ceasing – the life we see mirrored in a God who is described as three persons perfectly handing over, emptying themselves out, and then fully receiving what has been handed over – there will always be a centrifugal force flowing through, out, and beyond us" (p.57).

On the cover of this week's pew sheet is the famous fifteenth-century icon *Troitsa* (Trinity) also known as "The Hospitality of Abraham." It is a remarkable meditation on the Triune God. The figures are androgynous, perhaps male, perhaps female, perhaps both. They look tenderly, gently, lovingly at each other. The icon mysteriously draws the reader into this divine relationship. There is a powerful vulnerability depicted here, an encouragement to enter into the divine dance, an invitation to reach out, to reach in, to touch, and to be touched. "The touchable ones are the healed ones," writes Rohr (p.58) "it's pretty much that simple. There's no doctrinal test. There's no moral test. There's no checking out if they are Jewish, gay, baptised, or in their first marriage. There's only one question: 'Do you want to be healed?'" In my vulnerability, do I want to be healed? As a church, in our communal frailty and vulnerability, do we want to be healed?

Behold the Lamb of God, who takes away the sins of the world.

Blessed are those who are called to his supper.

Lord, I am not worthy to receive you, but only say the word and I shall be healed.

#### First Reading: Proverbs 8.22-31

Thus says the wisdom of God: "The Lord created me at the beginning of his work, the first of his acts of long ago. Ages ago I was set up, at the first, before the beginning of the earth. When there were no depths I was brought forth, when there were no springs abounding with water. Before the mountains had been shaped, before the hills, I was brought forth- when he had not yet made earth and fields, or the world's first bits of soil. #### **Gospel:** John 16.12-15

Jesus said to his disciples: "I still have many things to say to you, but you cannot bear them now. When the Spirit of truth comes, he will guide you into all the truth; for he will not speak on his own, but will speak whatever he hears, and he will declare to you the things that are to come. He will glorify me, because he will take what is mine and declare it to you. All that the Father has is mine. For this reason I said that he will take what is mine and declare it to you."


#### CONTRIBUTIONS TO CORPUS CHRISTI SUPPER - THU 20<sup>TH</sup> JUNE

This week St Peter's Bookroom is selling books for 3 days at the Spiritual Care Australia conference.


A new work by author Julie Perrin who will speak at the conference this week. A beautiful selection of reflections that can be used for meditations or group reflections.
