


I will bring such distress upon people that they shall walk like the blind; because they have sinned against the Lord, their blood shall be poured out like dust, and their flesh like dung.

As for this worthless slave, throw him into the outer darkness, where there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth."



#### Weekly Reflections

#### 2nd Sunday before Advent

Sunday's Parable of the Talents (referencing the macro-currency of the day rather than the human skill, but the shift of meaning in English is endlessly helpful to preachers) helps to answer questions about how each of our small and sometimes apparently insignificant lives contributes to God's plan. It is an answer to Trumpism, which calls us 'losers' unless we draw a similar-sized crowd to his.

The parable highlights the contribution the servants (who've been entrusted with substantial sums of their master's money) are expected to make to his business while he is away. It is not their money but his; they are busy on his behalf, not their own. Each one is given an amount 'according to his ability' (each vocation is unique). The master knows the ability of his servants, but does not impose any conditions on them, any levels of achievement that must be attained. There are no articulated *targets* (Church take note). They are entrusted with the money and asked to do what they are capable of doing.

The first two servants use their God-given resources, taking risks with and making decisions about something that is not their own. They are 'successful'. We might consider implicit in this that they 'succeed' as long as they are using the Talents in the service of their master, though the parable doesn't go there. The story leaves open how it is to be applied, but one could reasonably assume that 'success' equals the increase of God's community of believers and the spread of God's Kingdom. When the master returns, the faithful servants who put their lives in the service of their master's property get a share. This property turns out to be nothing less than a share in the life of the master himself – 'your master's happiness'.

In contrast the third servant does nothing. Worse, he tries to blame the master: he excuses his own inaction as motivated by fear of the master's fierce business reputation. This attempt at self-justification by taking control of the conversation and putting the master on trial, seeks to reverse their roles. The master, who put complete faith in his servant according to his ability, is accused of being untrustworthy.

The inadequacy of this claim (compare the freedom of initiative shown by the other servants) has to be exposed and the true order of things re-established. We

are God's trusted agents in going about God's business. If we don't trust God in return or if we try to go about God's business on our own terms, the parable implies, we will make a mess of it.

The connection between this parable and last week's (of the ready and unready bridesmaids) is caught by Nicholas Lash:


The distinction to be drawn lies not ... between action and passion, between "doing things" and having things done to one, but rather between behaving as if we were the centre of the world and learning that we are not.
